Introduction

DECEMBER MONTLY RESULT

MISL Monthly review meeting is to assess the organization performance and health, identify areas for improvement, and make data-driven decision. Our monthly review platform informed decision-making, aligning team with MISL objectives, and fostering a culture of continuous improvement.

November review meeting held on the 30th November, 2024 at the MISL Headquarters, Freetown at 9:30. The minutes were read and a motion was moved for adoption. The review meeting space was modified for deliberations on things not limited to:

- ✓ Filling and submission of the New Agreement between Medical Impact Mexico and Medical Impact Sierra Leone
- ✓ MISL Annual Report
- ✓ Grant writing "Challenges Facility for Civil Society Round 13" by Stop TB
- ✓ December 2024 end of year Medical brigade activity

Filling and submission of the New Agreement: Medical Impact Sierra Leone (MISL) has completed the filling and submission of the New Agreement between MIMX and MISL the final copy or document will be ready after both parties have signed.

Medical Impact Annual Report 2024: MISL annual report will detail the overview of MISL's activities and financial performance over the year 2024 and will be ready and submitted on the completion of the entire report not later than February 2025.

Grant writing "Challenges Facility for Civil Society Round 13" by Stop TB. Early December 2024 a link was shared by the Executive Manager of Medical Impact Mexico Dr. Giorgio Alberto Franyuti Kelly to MISL to apply for grant. Presently MISL is looking at the set criteria and trying to put ideas to apply for the said grant.

Actions update: December 2024 monthly activities, MISL proposed contain, outreach in three communities/Villages all of which beneficiaries intersect Royeama Banana Village Kamaraka Chiefdom Bombali District Northern Province of Sierra Leone in the midst of interventions in HIV/AIDS awareness, Malaria, worms infestation, diabetes, and hypertension BP.

Key Activity – Community – Based outreach programme in Prevention, Control and Treatment of HIV/AIDS, Malaria, Worm infestation, Diabetes and Hypertension.

Action Point:

The meeting resolute that since December is the last month of the year which also start the new month of MISL agreement, all documentations must be done for the submission of MISL annual report.

Conclusion:

MISL monthly review meetings give team members to review current progress against ideas performance. This meeting spent dissecting parts of our strategy, reviewing cash flows and other financials, and making adjustments based on overall performance.

Supporting Communities/Villages outreach programmes in Prevention, Control and Treatment of HIV/AIDS, Malaria, Worm infestation, Hypertension and Diabetes in three hard-to-reach communities in Royeama Bana, Kamaraka Chiefdom Bombali District Northern Province.







To increase the health coverage in hard to reach communities in Sierra Leone, MISL has concluded Medical Brigade outreach in three villages in Kamaraka Chiefdom Bombali District.

METHODOLOGY EMBRACED IN THE OUTREACH (MEDICAL BRIGADE IN ROYEAMA)

Prominent Community/Village stakeholders were acknowledged such as Chief, town crier, Religious leaders, Women & youth groups to mobilize the sick and to the site of meeting. About 50 people were targeted.

The Royeama Bana Community Health Office (CHO) Mr. Marrah called MISL Medical Brigade outreach to order. Welcoming MISL to Royeama Bana the CHO thanked MISL for their timely health intervention to gain more knowledge and get direct benefit from HIV/AIDS, Malaria, Worm infestation, Diabetes and Hypertension in their village and its environs.

CHO- Marrah was the team lead of medical professional; he welcomed the people in attendance and expressed thanks and appreciation for high turnout. Today you will benefit directly from this humanitarian health organization that is here from far away from Freetown to reach a deprived community like Royeama Bana and its surrounding villages. He explained about the medical issues or constraints they are going through in the community, but today I am overwhelmed to see MISL in our vulnerable community with lot of medicines to support us and I pray such donation will not stop here but will continue in the near future Mr. Marrah

proclaimed. He introduced his team and the Facility Management Committee (FMC).

Other speakers made similar statements including FMC – Chairman, Youth and Women's leaders etc.

Introducing Medical **Impact** Sierra Leone Team to Royeama Bana, the Project Manager II of MILS Martin Ibrhaim Bangura introduced the Executive Manager Alieu Badara Sesay, the Social and Communication Officer Mariatu Fullah Bangura and the Project Manager II Martin Ibrahim Bangura. He said MISL is presently operating in six districts in Sierra Leone and has it head office in Freetown.

In responding to the warm welcomed from Royeama Bana CHO, the Executive Manager of MISL, brings greeting from the parent body of Medical Impact headquarters from Mexico (Happy Christmas and Prosperous New year). One of our objectives is to advance the health of vulnerable and deprived communities around the world. He furthered in his brief but explicit statement that they are here to give direct talks or awareness on HIV/AIDS and give prevention, control and treatment on Malaria, Worm infestation, Diabetes and Hypertension. Our key activities today will focus on HIV/AIDS sensitization (to reduce Denial and Discriminations), testing for Malaria, deworm, diabetes and provide adequate medication, give health advice and referral on these areas and others to help redefine health care delivery for all we oblige. If we win or secure more grants/funds we'll support you in not too distance future. "I am happy to be here with you, my team and the host CHO team to give this support to those who need it most" "our motto is impacting Lives, Prescribing Hope" said Alieu Badara Sesay

Sister Christiana thanked MISL and express appreciation she said such outreach has never reach their communities she urges/request to MISL to continue this outreach or medical brigades at least quarterly in Royeama Bana and its environs.



Treatment- Malaria: (Artimet 4/4)

Diabetes Test kit- Rapid Diagnostic Test (RDT) used because already suspected and vulnerable clients must have taken their breakfast.

Treatment-Metformin/Metformine tablet/Comprime BP drug administration and pieces of advice/counseling service and referrals rendered.

Hypertension- blood pressure readings using electronic and manual kits Treatment-administered or dispensed Nifedipine tablets and 75% /10% aspirin drug.

BIEN PARA tablets

Worm remedy-No lab testing but client must have been screen of taking worm remedy over minimum of 3months

Drug administered Albendazole Tablets USP 400mg






BENEFICIALRIES: 50 direct beneficiaries.

- Poor network


The Rate of health status of participants screened for the four (4) diseases Malaria, Hypertension, Diabetes and Worm infestation at Royeama Bana and its Environs
